  - Linda was an avid proofreader and a strong academic. She motivated her Latin students to achieve at very high levels: she set a high bar, and her students met it.
  - 1999: 6 of 10 of Linda's students took places in an essay contest about democracy, including one, who won a trip to participate in a dig in Athens.
  - Linda's students knew they could count on her for everything and everything.
