Our Spring 2019 meeting featured a birthday cake in tribute to the ACL, and the Central Virginia Latin Teachers Association and Virginia Junior Classical League have teamed up to present a wonderful experience in August. In addition, there are four museum exhibitions of note taking place this summer. The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts is hosting "A



Return to the Grand Tour: Micromosaic Jewels from the Collection of Elizabeth Locke", which the VMFA itself has described with "The works of art on view in this exhibition, which are predominantly stunning pieces of jewelry, are dazzling in their exquisite detail and craftsmanship. In addition to the tiny enameled glass that forms the mosaic, eye-catching designs include gold, precious stones, and diamonds." More information can be found at <https://bit.ly/2HhZrNC>. The VMFA will also soon be hosting "Egypt's Sunken Cities," which features remains of two formerly-lost ancient cities.

The National Geographic Museum is hosting a "Queens of Egypt" exhibit, featuring 300 artifacts, a 3-D tour of a tomb, and even a scavenger hunt. More information can be found at <https://bit.ly/2BXIeHv>.

Finally, the Science Museum of Virginia is hosting "Pompeii: The Immortal City" starting in June. According to the Science Museum, "Over 100 archaeological items originating from Pompeii, including a large number being exhibited for the first time, demonstrate the knowledge the Romans had about nature as well as their scientific and technical know-how at the moment when Vesuvius erupted in 79 A.D." Salvete, amici et amicae,

Summer approaches, and we are all looking forward to some R & R—recreation and research. Both are necessary to keep us at our best during the school year. When we are lucky, we can enjoy this R & R at the same time—and we are very lucky this summer. A substantial set of relevant museum exhibitions have just opened in Virginia and DC, or are heading our way soon, and each one offers a wealth of opportunities to explore new avenues for thinking and teaching about the ancient world. The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond is presenting from now till September 2nd “A Return to the Grand Tour: Micromosaic Jewels from the Collection of Elizabeth Locke.” This exhibition offers the chance to examine 18th to 19th century jewelry with depictions of Roman architecture and other wonders from Italy rendered in miniature mosaics. They were a great souvenir of the Grand Tour, and they are still a delightful addition to the classical tradition today.

In addition, the National Geographic Museum in Washington, DC, is hosting “Queens of Egypt,” featuring the legendary Nefertari, Nefertiti, Hatshepsut, and Cleopatra VII, from now till September 15th; and the Science Museum of Virginia in Richmond will be offering “Pompeii: The Immortal City” from June 8th till September 3rd. Finally, Peter Schertz, curator of ancient art at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, has told me that yet another exhibition is coming soon. The VMFA will be hosting “Egypt’s Sunken Cities,” featuring Ptolemaic and Roman finds recovered off the coast of Egypt. This exhibition recently appeared at the Minneapolis Institute of Art, and it was in St. Louis before that.

As I close, I want to say a word of appreciation concerning the many colleagues who make the wheels of CAV turn. For every contest, there are writers, judges, and people who put together the awards lists and the awards themselves. For every professional recognition award—teaching, service, and professional development—there is a committee that shepherds the award process through to success. For every meeting, there are people at the host institution smoothing our way. CAV could not function without these members. Please consider volunteering for an office or a committee. 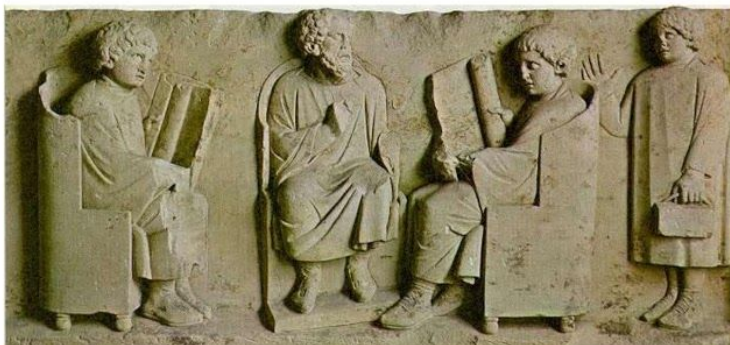
