Classical Association of Virginia Arthur F. Stocker Latin Essay Contest Spring 2024

The contest is free and open to all K–12 Latin students of CAV members. Encourage your students to participate—for the experience, not just glory!

First-year Latin

Trivium Romanum / A Roman crossroads story or essay, freely interpreted as the student wishes (100–200 words)

Second-year Latin

Mane in oppido Romano / Early morning in a Roman town story or essay, freely interpreted as the student wishes (150–250 words)

Advanced Latin

Laetitia et tristitia in litteris Latinis / Joy and sadness in Latin literature

story or essay, freely interpreted as the student wishes, using as a starting point any Latin that they have read (200–300 words)

OR:

Free Writing, Any Level

Dea aut deus cum animalibus feris in silva, caelo, aut mare / A goddess or god with animals in the forest, sky, or sea, story or essay, freely interpreted as the student wishes (First Year Latin 100-200 words, Second 150-250, Third 200-300)

2024 CLASSICAL ESSAY CONTEST TOPICS

- The CAV Classical Essay Contest is designed to recognize those students who have submitted outstanding essays in English on a topic appropriate to each level or class.
- The contest is open to students in the public and private middle and high schools of Virginia, and homeschoolers, whose teachers are current members of the Classical Association of Virginia.
- Essays shall be submitted in English on the following topics in the following divisions:

Latin I: Roman Festivals

Latin II: Fact and Fiction in Rome's Beginnings

Latin III: Omina sunt omnia: Foretelling the Future in Ancient Rome

Advanced Latin (Latin IV and above):

Vergil: What does Aeneas' range of emotions say about him as a hero?
 History: Casus Belli Gallici: Evaluate Caesar's case for making war in Gaul

Poetry: What does Rome look like through the eyes of its satirists?

N.B. Latin III students who do the general third year topic will be judged only with other Latin III students. They may also submit an essay in one of the advanced topics, and they will be judged in the same pool as all entries.

N.B., Students in Latin III and above may submit essays on more than one topic.

N.B., Latin I: If there are sufficient entries, there may be two judging pools: one for middle school and one for high school.

N.B., Unless they make a written request otherwise, students are giving the CAV permission to publish their names and work in any official publications. Winners will be announced and prizes awarded at the Spring meeting.

- Essays should be **roughly 1000 words**, typed **double space**. The **pages of the essay must be numbered**. The first page of the essay may include a title. The **student's name and school must not appear** on any page of the essay.
- Each entry must come with a **COVER PAGE** that includes:
 - Name of the contestant;
 - Name and address of the school;
 - Name of the teacher;
 - Year of Latin studied in '23 '24 (1st, 2nd, etc.);
 - Student grade level;
 - Level of contest;
 - Essay topic
- Essays should present a clear, coherent synthesis of material researched. It is also the policy to accept
 essays that are closer to creative writing exercises than to the traditional expository essay, provided that
 the same amount of factual content and critical thought is in evidence

• The fee is \$2.00 per student. Ineligible entries will be discarded. Teachers who are not members of CAV should send their \$20.00 dues with the entrance fee. Make checks payable to the Classical Association of Virginia.

This includes a colleague, supervisor, student (current or former), parent of a student (current or former), or a member of the general community who appreciates the work of a CAV member.
