OPENING ARTICLE - PRESIDENT

Our fall meeting will start with a presentation by Susan T. Stevens, whose talk, "A Political Construction of Sanctity at Carthage," will treat us to conclusions from the upcoming second volume on her archaeological work at Bir el Knissia. Susan has pieced together new connections that yield a new understanding of the late antique site.

After our box lunch (make your choices on the registration form), Robert Rigby will speak on "The Religiosity of Enslaved People in Rome." The talk has practical implications for how we present Festivals and other aspects of Roman Life, with a particular focus on winter festivals. Some elements of comparison to the experiences of enslaved Africans in the United States will lend themselves to discussion of teaching about enslavement in a secondary classroom in Virginia.

Finally, "Growing a Latin Program in a Small School" with Leanne Hanson, who teaches at Altavista Combined School. She's going to share with us the work she's done over the last several years to build the Latin program at a rural school. We're all concerned about bringing up the next generation of enthusiasts, and I'm looking forward to Leanne's hopeful advice.

I hope you will be able to join us in Charlottesville for new perspectives and good conversations.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE


President's Message

Already in the thick of rehearsals for the Randolph College Greek Play, I find myself struck again by the deep satisfaction of spending time with a text and finding the riches in it. Attention to detail is something most disciplines benefit from, but I think it is a particular feature of our training as Classicists to recognize how significant even the smallest interpretive choice can be. We start with what case a word is or which shapes show what style a vase is, and eventually we learn to test and prod every detail for a new interpretation or a shifted understanding. When we're preparing the play, we have to make choices about every word and every step, and my company is used to my refrain of "wait, let me check the Greek" when something is just not quite working in rehearsal. More than once over the years we've found new ideas to add to the scholarly thinking about a play, and we always watch our audience come in and wish that they could spend as much time with the play as we have.

I hope as the academic year gets fully underway that you are finding some of the same joy in the exquisite details of what you're studying with your students.
